## Program Services

SafeHouse Main Street Transitional Living Program provides supervised apartment housing and offers program participants an opportunity to develop the life skills necessary to live independent, successful lives.

The program includes:

- A fully-furnished apartment that you may have to share with a roommate.
- Help with groceries once a month.
- Individual, case management to help you achieve your goals.
- Assistance from an employment and education coordinator to help you apply for and keep a job and get the education you need.
- Life skills classes so once you leave the TLP, you have the skills you need to be a successful, independent adult.
- Weekly, one-on-one counseling (this is not optional).

## Requirements

Life is full of give and take. We’ll give you the tools to become a successful, independent adult and a “safety net” to catch you when you fall but in turn, we expect several things.

To be accepted to the program you must:

- Be between the ages of 18 and 21.
- Be homeless without any other options for housing.
- Complete a series of interviews to determine your capacity and willingness to enter the program.
- Pass a background and reference check. If you are on probation, you must let us know this on the application.
- Submit to and pass a drug test during the application process.
- Be willing to enter into a contract upon acceptance into the program which includes agreeing to certain behavioral conduct and working towards your goals.
- Attend school and work.
